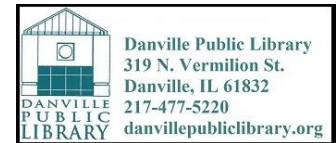




Danville Public Library's Money Smart Week April 21 – 27, 2018
