
There we will find Xi Jinping, the president of China, and learn of his "China Dream" for the future and how he is

Over the past year, the Danville Library Foundation and the Danville Public Library have experienced many changes. Please join me in thanking and congratulating Barb Nolan on 43 years of service. Welcome to the new Library Director, Theresa Tyner and to the new Youth Services Director, Rory Parilac.

I am so grateful for the kind generosity of so many donors, board members, special committee members, library staff, friends and community volunteers. Your charitable contributions in 2015 made it possible for the Foundation to contribute approximately \$83,000 to the library. The foundation's contributions enabled the library to purchase hundreds of books, in various formats including

print, E-books, talking books and larger print. You also helped to purchase audio-visual materials such as: DVD's, Blu-ray discs and recorded music. These educational and cultural materials, as well as newly developed outreach programs benefited children, teens, adults, elderly and persons with disabilities in our community. Programs provided by Father Flattery continued to engage and educate interested community members. In addition, your gifts assisted in purchasing a new outreach van and an outdoor electronic sign to help broadcast everything available within the library.

Grant requests made to the library included computer equipment upgrades for patrons and staff as well as a security camera upgrade. In May, a new outdoor stage was generously gifted by the Julius W. Hegeler II Foundation. This was celebrated and dedicated in memory of Bobette Steely

Hegeler. This wonderful asset to our community will provide entertainment for all ages for years to come!

The money raised from the "From Page to Stage" event, supported the purchase of new computer equipment and educational games for the children's department.

Thanks to all of our donors, over the past five years, the library foundation has contributed over \$264,000 to the library. Your ongoing support, friendship and kind generosity is much appreciated.

As I prepare and look forward to the coming year, I know there is more work to do to build on and even stronger future for the library foundation, to continue to fund the unmet needs of the library. Everyone at the library wishes you all a new year filled with good health, peace, prosperity and happiness.
